Josef Milinte Kulff, 77, son of Milesho and Mary Dmitruk, was born November 15, 1889 in Kamen Koszyrsh, Rajon, Russia, in the Province of Wolinska Oblast. He came to this country when a young man in 1907.

In 1920 he was married to Phoebe Guttomson at Austin, Minn., and they farmed southeast of Austin, northwest of Hayfield & at Oakdale, Blooming Prairie & Lansing before coming to Lyle 22½ years ago where he operated an Elevator & Feed Mill. The past few years he operated the North Star Station in Lyle.

Mr. Kulff died March 17, 1967 at St. Mary's hospital, Rochester, following a stroke without regaining consciousness.
