Waste Machine From France Used In Hog Operation

One of the bigger pork producing units in Iowa north of Clear Lake markets about 6,000 hogs per year and eventually may market 12,000 to 15,000 head.

Sam Kennedy, Jr., Clear Lake, showed a group from ISU the new liquid solid waste separation machine imported from France. Little odor was noted from the two lagoons and the solid waste rather than filling the lagoons goes to the field to boost next year's crop. The new machine, Sam noted, did a better job than a previous domestic one at about 1/4 the initial cost. A hog watering device Sam has brought back from France had cut his liquid losses to about nil.

The Europeans have been at the business of hog raising in confinement a lot longer than US producers and Kennedy is benefiting from their experiences.
